

Village of Shannon Curbside Refuse & Recycling Collection Program 2012

Moring Disposal is very pleased to announce on January 1, 2012 the Village of Shannon implemented a new automated program for curbside collection of household trash and recycled material. Moring Disposal would like to extend our sincere thanks to the Village of Shannon management as well as its residents for allowing our company the opportunity to continue serving your community. The information below provides you with an overview of how the new program will work. Residents who follow these guidelines closely will experience a significant improvement in the cleanliness and convenience of their refuse collection.

All residential dwellings up to and including (4) units that do not have dumpster service in the Village of Shannon will be provided with 2 - 65 gallon refuse carts (typically referred to as "toters") to contain your household trash and recycled items. The toters are equipped with a lid, wide base and durable wheels which make them easily guided and manageable, even with heavy loads. In the event that you have more trash than your 65 gallon toter will hold, extra bags may be set out next to your toter. Each extra bag will require a garbage sticker, which may be purchased at any of the following locations:

UPCOMING IMPORTANT DATE

Monday, January 9th – Holiday schedule pick up days are over and Monday weekly service resumes.

Bulky items (old furniture, mattresses, etc.) and appliances will require garbage stickers in order to be picked up at the curb. Residents will need to call Moring Disposal to make arrangements for these items. Residents should also keep in mind that it is common for appliance retailers to accept old appliances for disposal when new ones are purchased.

Please note that beginning January 1st, 2012, electronic items were banned from Illinois landfills, therefore, no large or small electronics will be accepted in your trash. There are many other disposal opportunities listed at www.moringdisposal.com. We will be updating the website often with new disposal options (e-recycling) in the area.

RECYCLABLE ITEM PREPARATION

METAL PRODUCTS

Tin & Aluminum Cans, formed aluminum and tin containers including old pie and cake tins. Be sure that all items are empty. Place lids inside of cans, **Labels do not have to be removed.**

GLASS PRODUCTS

Glass Jars & Bottles only: Empty container & remove lids. **Labels do not have to be removed.**

PLASTIC PRODUCTS

Plastic Jugs and bottles: Containers with the numbers 1 through 7 on the bottom (Except Styrofoam). Empty container & remove lids. **Labels do not have to be removed.**

PAPER PRODUCTS

Newsprint: All newsprint is acceptable.

Junk Mail: Includes envelopes, fliers, brochures, bill stubs and advertisements in bills, old papers, all white and colored papers. Place in paper grocery bag or container.

Brown Kraft Paper Bags: Grocery, shopping, lunch bags, Etc.

Corrugated (Cardboard Boxes): Break down, bundle or neatly stack in manageable sizes not to exceed 3 feet square.

Other Cardboard: Food boxes such as cereal, baking goods, hamburger helper, macaroni, pasta type boxes, clothing boxes, shoe boxes, toy & game boxes, Beverage cartons, i.e. 6, 12, 24 count packaging. Bundle or bag all items.

GENERAL RECYCLING GUIDELINES

- 65 Gallon toters with tan lids may be set out every week and should contain recycled items **ONLY**
- Recycling toters should be set out the night before your pick up day or no later than 5:00 a.m. on your pick up day.
- Recycling toters should be placed at the curb on one side of the driveway and the trash toter on the other.
- All recycled material can be co-mingled together in your recycling toter.
- Plastic bags of any sort only contaminate recycled material in our system. **Please do not use any plastic bags to contain excess recyclable items.**
- All recycled items placed in your toter must be empty and free of food or drink residue.

GARBAGE PREPARATION GUIDELINES

- All 65 gallon trash toters with chocolate brown lids must be at the curb by 5:00 A.M.
- Residents should bag all perishable items to maintain cleanliness of the toters. We recommend to bag your items whenever possible to keep them clean and prevent blowing of loose material on windy days.
- **Only extra trash bags not exceeding 35 gallons in capacity or 35 lbs. in weight** can be set with your trash toter and will be collected with a \$1.00 pre-paid extra trash sticker securely attached to the neck of the bag. Stickers can be purchased at the following locations:

- Loose uncontained items will not be picked up.

TOTER PLACEMENT GUIDELINES

- The front side of the toter has the toter number and should face the street with the lid closed.
- There will be no alley pick up of toters.
- On streets *without* curbs and gutters, toters should be placed at the end of your driveway flush with the road.
- Streets *with* curbs and gutters should place the toter in the road 8-12 inches out from the curb.
- The trash toter should be placed on one side of the drive with the recycling toter on the opposite side.
- If toters are set on a side street or property with no drive, they should be set at least 5 feet apart.
- Toter access should be unobstructed. In cases where vehicles are parked in the roadway, toters must be set out even with the driver's side edge of the vehicle and placed at least 5 feet away from vehicles.
- Toters should be removed from the curb on your pick up day by 6:00pm.
- Toters can be kept between pick up days outside or in your garage.
- The toters delivered to an address are assigned to that address. If you move from your residence, place both toters inside the garage or other secure area for the next resident's use.

Bulky Waste: Single furniture items, items that will not fit *easily* into the toter, etc. are considered bulky items. Residents are asked to call to make arrangements as a separate truck will need to be sent out for these. Each bulky item will require (5) pre-paid extra trash stickers. Sectionals will require (5) extra trash stickers per section. Residents are encouraged to seek scrap metal dealers for discarded metal items.

Major Appliances (White Goods): Stoves, dishwashers, washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers, water heaters, water softeners and air conditioners are all considered major appliances. Residents can contact Moring Disposal to make arrangements for removal of these items. Each appliance set out for pickup must have (15) pre-paid extra trash stickers securely attached to them. **Refrigeration units must have Freon removed with a certification from a licensed technician attached prior to pickup.**

Construction / demolition debris: This debris requires special arrangements for pick up. Residents requiring service for construction debris can contact Moring Disposal to make special arrangements.

Household hazardous waste: Residents with household hazardous waste should look for county sponsored programs, which are held periodically.

Large dumpsters: are available for large clean-up or remodeling projects. Residents can contact Moring Disposal at the telephone number below for pricing or to order temporary containers.
